Protocol Title: Creating a Participant-Based, First-Person Record of Anti-War Protests
at the National and Local Levels

Please read this consent document carefully before you decide to participate in this study.

Purpose of the research study:

The goals of this project focus on the recordation of the event. Specifically, the use of digital media (camcorders) and computer mapping will be employed to document things from the Principal Investigator's point-of-view during the day. As I march, I will be interested in noting where certain activities appear to occur with greater frequency and/or intensity. Also, careful analysis of the survey responses will allow me to make recommendations for organizations like the A.N.S.W.E.R. Coalition and other activist groups. For instance, if certain cross-sections of America seem poorly represented then I can work with these groups to focus future work among such cross-sections in an attempt to inclusively organize citizens regardless of race, class, ethnicity, and so on.

What you will be asked to do in the study:

You are only asked to take a short online survey(s). If you attended the national *March on Pentagon* event as well as a March 20th *Student Day of Action Against the War* you are invited to fill out both surveys.

Time required:

Risks:

There are no anticipated risks.

Compensation & Benefits:

There is no compensation or benefits for your involvement.

Confidentiality:

Level of confidentiality is decided by the participant. If you want to remain anonymous, you may do so by neglecting to fill in the name and email questions on the survey. However, if you do submit your name and email address, these will be kept confidential and only known to the Principal Investigator.

Voluntary participation:

Your participation in this study is completely voluntary.

Right to withdraw from the study:

You have the right to withdraw from the study at anytime without consequence. Therefore, I ask you not to start the survey if you do not intend to finish it.
